Catasetums are from the Tribe Cymbidieae. Individually, it has been considered an orchid oddity, or “botanical”, of interest mainly to the seriously addicted enthusiast. These plants have a brief deciduous period in winter, when the plants need a definite dry rest period bordering on neglect. These robust orchids are native to lowland tropical forests in Central and South America and are usually grown in warm or intermediate conditions.

Commercially, *Catasetum*, have occupied a small market niche on the edge of a sea of Cymbidiums, Cattleyas, Phalaenopsis, Dendrobiums, Epidendrums, and so on. Until recently, they have not attracted much attention from hybridizers, but in the past several years some spectacular hybrids have been produced, receiving great acclaim and an increasingly large collection of awards from the American Orchid Society.

This talk will feature a widescreen computer slide show on some of the species, new hybrids and plant culture of *Catasetums*. The presenter will be Fred Clarke of Sunset Valley Orchids in Vista.

Minutes of the SFOS Board Meeting

SFOS Board Meeting- October 13, 2015

The meeting started at 7:40.

I. Treasurer

A. Jack: The financial information for the SFOS is getting more organized. He is working with Beverly to synchronize her information without changing her system. Jack has been preparing reports for the board. SFOS, OITP and POE figures are still not broken out, but the reports show our financial information more clearly. QuickBooks is now online with funds going directly to the bank accounts. Balances as of September 30: Checking \$12,191.43, High Yield Savings \$168,595.15, Market Rate Savings \$1,507.31.

II. Vice President

A. Mary: November speaker is Fred Clarke, topic: Catasetum Species, Hybrids and the Plant Culture. He will also provide the Opportunity Table. Tom Perlite will run the Skill Session on repotting Odontoglossums. The December meeting will be the Potluck Holiday Party. January's speaker will be Pierre Pujol, topic: Cymbidium Culture. He will also provide the Opportunity Table. Skill Session TBA. February's speaker will be Ron Parsons, topic: Adventures in Southeast Australia. Sam Tsui has been rescheduled for the April 2016 meeting, and Peter Lin is scheduled for the May meeting.

III. Membership

A. Claire: One new member from the Peninsula Orchid Society joined this month. Renewals for 2016 have begun, and a reminder will be made at the next meeting. Jack noted that the press release for POE is on the SFOS website. Claire is trying to encourage any new members who show interest to get involved with SFOS functions. The mentor program has had low sign up so far, but there may be a need to increase the understanding of the program and encourage younger and newer members to take part. It was suggested to have a sign at the membership table or between the doors to the Hall and the Skill Session room to advertise the Skill Session, and call it How To: session to clarify for new members. Claire suggested that a new member orientation should be held yearly in February or March instead of the Skill Session. Claire also noted that going to other societies' meetings encourages them to join the SFOS, or volunteer for the POE and OITP. IV. POE

B. Tom: 43 vendors have committed and paid so far. The balance is due on October 15th. There will be some new vendors this year. There are 4 booths still open; these may be used for sponsors. Arader Gallery will have a double booth in the vendor area in addition to their exhibit of antique prints and watercolors. Lyngso Garden Materials has agreed to supply rocks and soil for the exhibit area. Belcampo Meats is the main food provider, and will have a wine and beer bar as well. We still need a coffee vendor and perhaps an ice cream vendor. Ambrosia Bakery is unable to staff a booth, but can provide pastries at cost to either Belcampo or the coffee vendor if needed. Invitations have been sent out to individual exhibitors and Orchid Societies. So far the Conservatory of Flowers and Orchid Conservation Alliance have responded. UC Botanical Garden would like an information booth, but cannot install an exhibit or provide plants for the entrance exhibit. Careers in Horticulture will not participate this year, as their program has been temporarily suspended. S.F. Foliage has lost their green house space as the greenhouses are scheduled to be torn down. They have tentatively agreed to provide foliage for the exhibit area as a sponsor. A. Silvestri & Co. has agreed to provide statuary/benches again in the exhibit area, as a sponsor. Kevin Woodson will have an exhibit of original watercolors and will conduct an exhibition of watercolor painting during the show on Saturday. Other sponsors: Metamorphosis Landscaping, Bath Fitters, Renewal by Anderson and Sungevity will have vendor booths in the sales area, and SF Chronicle may have a truck out in front of the venue. We still do not have a major sponsor.

V. Old Business

A. Insurance: Dave had new quotes from Paul Perlite for theft and fraud insurance. We currently have a \$5000 policy with a \$250 deductible. The new quote for \$50,000 coverage has a \$5000 deductible. A discussion was held about money being handled and transferred to the bank during the POE and OITP, and the need for the extra coverage. Jean made a motion to increase the coverage to \$50,000. The motion was seconded and passed with one member opposed.

B. Denim Shirts: Mary is having samples made in sizes S to XL. The samples will be there for the November SFOS meeting so people can try them on and choose their size. Prices for the shirts will be announced at the meeting. The motif will be the Embroidered Lycaste image with SFOS underneath. Jean has volunteered to take the orders during the meeting.

C. Newsletter Backup Editor: There has been no response so far to Stanford's request to find and start training a backup editor. Another announcement will be posted in the November newsletter.

VI. New Business

A. December Holiday Party: Last year the food was part catered and part potluck. Dave will contact Paula Shiu to see if she will do the catering again this year, and see what she provides and what else will be needed for the party, including some decorative

Notes from the Prez

Less is More. Small is Beautiful.

I've recently come to a conclusion about orchids. Small is beautiful. No, not miniature orchids (sorry Mary and Ron), but small* numbers of orchids. It's widely known that orchid growers often suffer from OCD (Orchid Compulsion Disease), resulting in large collections of orchids and thin wallets. I've wavered on the edge for a while, but as my greenhouse filled up, I've come to see it as a microcosm of the Earth, with definite limits to growth. At OITP this year, after I donated about a quarter of the orchids in my greenhouse to the Orchid Conservation Fund, I found that there was much more room for the remaining plants. Room to grow, room to see each plant, room to appreciate each plant. While moving them out to take to the show, I remember I broke two flower spikes, simply because the plants were too close together in the greenhouse. I was annoyed, and stressed that I might break another spike. Grrr...

Orchid growing should be fun! Yes, I know that there are members who grow them commercially, for whom orchids puts bread on the

table. But for most of the rest of us, it's a pastime, a hobby which hopefully rewards us with flowers or some form of satisfaction for the hours we devote to them. That reward might be the pride in flowering a difficult to grow species, or the knowledge gained by the experience of growing a new species. Later, after OITP, I found that I had a little more time to spend doing tasks that I had neglected for so long. Dividing that overgrown *Masdevallia*, mounting that little *Laelia* that was eagerly putting out some little new roots. I am enjoying my time in the greenhouse more, doing more with what I have. Less is more. Small is beautiful.
*Note: small is a relative term...


