From the November Speaker - Jeff Tyler:

My name is *Jeff Tyler* and I have enjoyed growing plants ever since I can remember.

As a young kid growing up in Corpus Christi (Texas), I would grow anything I could from cuttings, seeds, etc...

When I was about 16, I lived in a rental home, and my dad and I built a greenhouse.

It was at this time that I first tried growing orchids and I failed miserably!

I was very good at growing hoyas, begonias and many other tropical plants.

Unfortunately I did not live in that home long enough to master growing orchids.

I also don't think I had the patience at the time.

Our next home was a townhouse and due to the limited outdoor space, I decided to try growing African Violets inside under lights.

I soon joined the African Violet society and later also joined a Bonsai Society. This was a very fun time for me and I did really well with the violets.

I moved to Sacramento (California) in 1988, and as a young adult I gave up growing plants for the most part, living in apartments is not very conducive to growing plants, plus I was too busy being young and hanging out with friends.

Then 16 years ago I purchased my first home with my spouse. In the spring of 2003 I built a 10' x 12' greenhouse and decided to try my hand at growing orchids again. In the summer of 2007 I built a second greenhouse (that is 14' x 20'), and you can probably guess that I had been bitten very hard by the orchid bug and was much more patient and successful at growing them this time.

In 2013 I built a third greenhouse (that is 14' x 20') and I also now have three outdoor protected growing areas where I grow many types of orchids year round with no cooling (other than a few fans) or heating. The temperatures range from 30 - 110 degrees F, with the extremes usually lasting only 10 - 12 days out of the year.

I belong to two orchid societies (Orchid Forum & Sacramento Orchid Society) and am very involved in both. I've been a board member on both societies, V.P. for the Forum several times over the years and President once. I've installed several orchids gardens for both societies and won many show trophies for these garden displays.

I currently grow around 2000 different orchids, with my main focus and passion being bulbophyllum, Australian dendrobiums and miniature orchids. I also have a great interest in dendrochilum along with anything strange or unusual from the orchid world. I have garnered 35 AOS awards, some of which are garden display trophies.

SFOS Board Meeting Minutes - Monday, October 9, 2017

Present: Mary Gerritsen, Dave Hermeyer, Ron Norris, Erik Sayle, Jeff Harris, , Jason Douglass, Antonnette Queri

Excused: Valerie Mountain, Alvin Hom, Claire Zvanski,

1. President's Updates

a. Hall Of Flowers (HOF) (aka SF County Fair Bldg) reservations for all events planned in 2018 ok'd by Eric Jue of SF Park & Rec except for our general meeting times for the first Tuesday of Feb and May – we tentatively held the second Tuesday of the month for Feb & May while exploring other options.

b. HOF reserved for OITP, 7/21-22, set up 7/20.

2. CFO Updates:

a. Financial report review: We reviewed and endorsed the financial statement.. The bank statements will be made available to board members upon request. We don't want to put bank statements online however as they contain confidential info.

b. Update on fraud case: Inspector spoke to some members. Things are progressing. They have finalized the amount of money in dispute. Jeff made a motion to send a second demand letter to the perpetrator, including our expenses, contingent on the agreement of the inspector. Ron seconded the motion, and it carried unanimously.

c. Discussion item: We need to develop an organizational list of who has items like keys (to mailbox, lockers in storage area, locker in kitchen) or any other things we need to track. Jeff agreed to start working on it.

d. We looked at the POE budget. Jeff made a motion to approve the POE budget, Erik seconded, no further discussion, passed unanimous in favor.

e. Mary made a motion to pay back the loan from Dave Hermeyer. Jeff seconded. In subsequent discussion Mary noted that the board needs to closely examine financial statements etc to avoid having the same problem occurring again. The vote was unanimous in favor of the motion. The board thanks Mauree Clarke and Dave Hermeyer on behalf of the entire society for the loan of the money to help the society get through those hard times after the incident.

f. The orchid bark "deal" we had discussed doing a bulk order was no cheaper than how we normally would get it. We are still exploring options but not moving forward on anything yet.

3. Vice President's Updates:

a. Regarding bios, we have pics and bios of the majority of board members to post on our website. We feel it's good to provide this info so members can see who is representing them as well to recognize them.

b. The SFOS/POE history compilation project is moving forward slowly. A lot of people Jeff has contacted expressed interest in contributing, but it will take several months of time and effort. If any members would like to help Jeff facilitate the gathering and organization of this info in any way that would be greatly appreciated.

c. Jeff is trying to launch the new Member Planet software to be used by the Membership Chairs and others for society functions beyond the newsletter, but it has been a slow process. The effort will continue behind the scenes – and may be launched in phases – perhaps as a "beta-test" for members to update profiles on this platform with a goal to use it for dues renewals next year.

d. Unfortunately another group has rented out the Hall of Flowers on the 1st Tuesday of Feb and May. This means it's possible we may need to reschedule to the second Tuesday of Feb and May for our general meeting or find alternate meeting accommodations. Jeff will work out the details ASAP. More info to come soon.

e. Board Onboarding materials sent to new board member (Antonnette Queri)

4. POE Update (from Ron on behalf of the Show Steering Committee)

a. Reservation confirmed for Hall of Flowers.

b. Hours and pricing have been set.

c. Theme - "Curiouser and Curiouser, Orchids in Wonderland" – thank you to member Taylor Luscutoff, who was awarded 2 POE 2018 Gala Tickets for submitted the winning theme.

d. POE Budget was presented as part of the CFO report.

e. POE organizational structure still need to fill vacancies. We have some members who have volunteered, but we need more. Please contact Ron (or another Steering Committee Member – Mary, Jason, Jeff or Kara) to volunteer

f. Board members are contacting potential POE sponsors & silent auction donors. Ron and Jason have a sponsor form letter and will try to improve it further. Any member of the society can help with this.

If you know folks or companies that may be interested in sponsorship of POE in general, for advertising in the program and/or contributing items to the silent auction PLEASE contact Ron or Jason ASAP. \$500 is minimum (up to \$30,000 – to be "the" show sponsor).

g. Help needed by the 2019 POE committee – searching for a different/larger venue that we can afford. Any members with ideas, insights or motivation to help - contact Ron Norris.

5. Old Business

a. By Laws update - board wants to amend the By-laws if it is determined necessary to allow us to continue conduct of virtual rather than face-to-face meetings – topic remains under review by Claire Zvanski for presentation to the board for a vote.

b. Board "health check." – discussion around the need to do periodic "health checks" to maintain good interpersonal relationships – the focus is on how we communicate with each other (whether positive or negative) to keep our motivation and morale as high as possible.

6. New Business

a. "Who are new members?" discussed ways to improve new member outreach – perhaps giving all new members a "welcome gift" like the new Gerritsen "Bay Area Guide"

b. Mary went to the Portland Orchid Society meeting and shared their approach to "show

and tell.” The approach involved a procedure similar to ribbon judging – where plants are “judged” anonymously in small groups and by a few plant categories – this quick activity helped to get everyone interacting and actively learning from each other – and then small awards given out. We agreed we would like to try this approach once next year - see how it’s received and go from there.

c. Seeking new SFOS Librarian to replace Chuck Chan – please contact Chuck or Ron if potentially interested.

7. Meeting Closure - Review of action items:

a. Ron will send out board meetings on Google calendar to remind board members of the meeting times.

b. Jeff compiling list of keys/processes

c. Jason/Ron revising POE Sponsor letter and matrix

d. Jeff will work with Mary on piloting the Portland show and tell model – possibly at the January meeting

e. Jeff investigating options for local greenhouse tours.

f. Motion to adjourn
